# Green & Healthy Schools Provider

This past June, Pringle's naturalist went to the MacKenzie Center in Poynette to be a part of a new network of Provider organizations to Wisconsin's Green & Healthy Schools (GHS) program.

The GHS program was created to help provide recognition for schools who reduce environmental impact, improve health and wellness for students and the larger school community, and prepare students who are environmentally literate, STEM -strong, ready to understand the sustainability challenges ahead. Anyone in the school community can get their school started. The state wanted to create a support system for schools to help retain their GHS status, so they approached green organizations to become Providers.

Members of the provider net-

work support one or many focus areas within GHS Wisconsin. Providers may coach schools through the entire process or provide professional development or curriculum resources for one or two aspects.

As a Provider, Pringle hopes to support and encourage schools through the GHS application process as well as to boost those that already are.

# Mighty Acorns New Curriculum

Over the past two years, the Mighty Acorns partnership worked to create a new curriculum that was better aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards and Common Core. The curriculum was also twenty years old and needed a fresh, new look.

Last school year, a few of the partner locations tested the new curriculum to help work out the bugs of the program.

The basic format of the program has remained the same - three visits to the site with a pre- and post-lesson plan for the classroom teacher to do with each visit, an on-site activity, free exploration, and a stewardship activity. The lessons are also now grouped into two themed tracks for teachers to choose from.

Starting with this school year, Mighty Acorns will be open to third, fourth, and fifth grade classes. Many of the partners felt it was hard to get and retain the sixth grade since many of the students were now going off to different schools.

WDNR natural resources

- educator positions have been eliminated, individuals in those positions have been moved to other positions within the department. The WAEE is working with the WDNR to identify educational programs remaining and where and how to move educational resources and programs with no home.
- Specific cuts within UW-Extension (UWEX) are still being determined. The WAEE says that this is the largest cut in UWEX history and estimates currently project

an equivalent reduction of approximately 60-80 positions. UWEX is considering combining services so that personnel may no longer exist in every county. For example, county extension agents in the future may span multiple counties instead of an agent in each county.

We will continue to keep you informed about statewide environmental education impacts as we know more from the Wisconsin Association for Environmental Education. In the meantime, thank you for those of you who spoke out to help save as much as we did in this budget cycle.

# EE in Wisconsin Update

Now that Wisconsin's state budget has been signed, here is a summary of results for environmental education:

- Wisconsin Center for Environmental Education (WCEE) mandate restored
- Department of Public Instruction environmental education consultant position and authority restored
- Alternative teacher licensure proposal failed Wisconsin's EE mandate for pre-service teachers remains in effect.
- Wisconsin Environmental Education Board (WEEB) eliminated a year later than originally planned (June 30, 2017 now) thanks to last minute action by Joint Committee on Finance. WEEB is offering one more grant program for projects in 2016 (general EE grants and forestry education/school forest grants - RFP expected by September 1 with deadline of October 31 and projects running Jan 2016-Dec 2016.)
